


ID Exceptions

If any voter has a “reasonable impediment” to showing photo ID (whether in person or by mail), they may fill out an ID Exception Form and vote a provisional ballot. A reasonable impediment is something that prevents the voter from showing ID. The voter must provide their reason by selecting from the following permitted exceptions:

1. Lack of transportation
 2. Disability or illness
 3. Lack of birth certificate or other documents needed to obtain ID
 4. Work schedule
 5. Family responsibilities
 6. Lost or stolen photo ID
 7. Photo ID applied for but not yet received
 8. Other reasonable impediment (if selected, the voter must write the reason on the form)
 9. The voter has a religious objection to being photographed.
 10. The voter was a victim of a natural disaster within 100 days before Election Day.
 11. (For mail voters only) Unable to attach a copy of photo ID
- County boards of elections must count provisional ballots with properly completed ID Exception Forms.

VOTER PHOTO ID REQUIREMENT

Beginning with the 2023 municipal elections, North Carolina voters will be asked to show photo ID when they check in to vote. Voters who vote by mail will be asked to include a photocopy of an acceptable photo ID when returning their ballot by mail.

What photo ID can I use?

Any of the following that is unexpired or expired for one year or less:

- North Carolina Driver's License
- U.S. Passport Book/U.S. Passport card
- State ID from NCDMV ("non-operator ID")
- NC Voter Photo ID card, issued by a county board of elections
- College/university student ID approved by State Board of Elections
- Charter school employee ID approved by State Board of Elections
- State/local government employee ID approved by State Board of Elections
- Driver's license/non-driver ID from another state, D.C. or U.S. territory (only if voter registered in NC within 90 days of election)

Any of the following, regardless of whether the ID contains an expiration or issuance date:

- Military or veteran 10 card issued by the U.S. government
- Tribal enrollment card issued by a State or federally recognized tribe
- ID card issued by a U.S. government agency or the State of NC for a public assistance program

NOTE: Voters ages 65+ may use an expired ID if it was unexpired on their 65th birthday.





(Only if voter registered in NC within 90 days of election day.)



Government Employee ID

All voters will be allowed to vote with or without a photo ID.

In-Person Voters

Voters must show an acceptable photo ID when they check in at their voting site during early voting or on Election Day. Election workers check to see if the picture on the ID reasonably resembles the voter. The address on the photo ID does not have to match the voter registration records.

If the voter does not show an acceptable ID, the voter may proceed in one of the two following ways:

1. Vote with an ID Exception Form and a provisional ballot, or
2. Vote with a provisional ballot and return to their county board of elections office with their photo ID by the day before county canvass. (For municipal elections in September and October, this deadline is the Monday following Election Day. For all other elections, the deadline is the second Thursday following Election Day.)

Absentee-By-Mail Voters

Voters who vote by mail must include a photocopy of an acceptable ID inside the "photo ID envelope" that comes with their ballot. Or they may complete an ID Exception Form with the absentee ballot return envelope.
